
A Lecture Series for the Grand Commandery MA/RI



Brother Ripa was promoted to the head of the fencing program for Brown University in 2017 after three years as assistant coach at Brown and assistant coaching assignments at Harvard University. In 2016 he was named Coach of the Year by the United States Fencing Coaches Association (USFCA). He has successfully coached competitors at US Cadet/Junior/ and Veteran world levels including those at NCAA All-American championships. Mr. Ripa is also well known overseas for his coaching and referee skills and is prominent in the sport. He brings great passion to the sport and to this particular subject matter.
